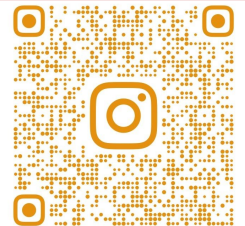
It's never too early to get a head start on the next set of decorations! Pink and red hearts for Valentine's Day were the order of the day as we spent the afternoon crafting and painting.
